# Free or discounted COVID-19 care available

## Access to COVID-19 therapeutics

If you test positive for COVID-19, a medical provider can prescribe an oral antiviral pill that reduces the risk of severe symptoms, hospitalization and death from COVID-19. Antiviral treatments must be taken within five days of the start of symptoms, so it's important to get care quickly.



• Free Paxlovid for patients with Medicare, Medicaid, and those who are uninsured

The federally sponsored <u>Patient Assistance Program (PAP</u>) will continue to provide Paxlovid at no cost through December 31, 2024 to patients who have Medicare, Medicaid, or those who are uninsured.

• Discounted Paxlovid for patients with private insurance

Pfizer's <u>Co-Pay Savings Program, PAXCESS</u>, provides privately-insured patients with a voucher up to \$1,500, potentially reducing their out-of-pocket cost

### **Access to COVID-19 treatment**

Conventional care options for COVID-19 are available through:

- Primary care providers.
- Free, low-cost clinics.
- Medicaid (if eligible).



#### **Reminder:**

COVID-19 treatment is not a substitute for vaccination, which can prevent serious illness, hospitalization, and death. COVID-19 vaccines are safe, effective, and available across Wisconsin.
